

Georgette Dumont, MPA, Ph.D.

Dr. Georgette Dumont is currently an Assistant Professor at the University of North Florida, in the Department of Political Science and Public Administration. She was hired in 2010 to teach in the Nonprofit Management concentration in the Masters of Public Administration program.

Dr. Dumont brings to her classes both her academic research and experiences from working in both the nonprofit and public sectors. Prior to entering higher education, she worked for a diverse set of nonprofits in Southeastern Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Illinois, from the United Way of Southeastern New England to the American Farmland Trust, as well as working for a public high school. She couples the knowledge gained through experience with her research on the nonprofit sector to engage and inform her students and the public about the nonprofit sector.

Dr. Dumont's research centers on nonprofit accountability, and she is currently contracted to write a book on the topic. She has conducted research on how nonprofits are utilizing new technologies in regard to accountability, and has produced a report for nonprofits in Northeast Florida on how they are using online technologies.

Dr. Dumont has also been a consultant to nonprofits and government on accountability, governance, and the usage of information communication technologies to help meet the organization's mission. She currently leads workshops for nonprofits about using technologies for fundraising, governance, and communication.

In addition to her teaching, research and consulting, Dr. Dumont blogs about nonprofit management, aggregates information on nonprofit management published in a daily e-newspaper, and actively shares current, pertinent information about nonprofits through Twitter and Facebook as 'Gette in Jax'.

Dr. Dumont currently resides in Jacksonville Beach with her husband, and two fine felines. She serves on the board of directors for Beaches Watch and remains attuned to local politics and administration.
